Started every game over four-year career; threesport athlete who serves as a surgeon in Sayre, Pa.

College FB HOF after winning national championship at LSU; led MU to 16 wins in his 20 games played

4x All-PSAC as running back was a 2x All-American

School's career rushing leader was 4x All-PSAC West First Team selection

Has coached at four PSAC schools over 40 years after HOF playing career at Edinboro

2x PSAC West Athlete of the Year maintains five single-season MU records

Joe Kimball, CO (1993-2001, (2009-18)

Head FB Coach and then AD for most successful 10year period in Laker history

John Langer, PO (1991-94)

DL who ranks among MU records in several categories; known for his philanthropical efforts

Longest tenured HC and most victories in school history; Won 2010 PSAC Championship

Member of College FB HOF is school's all-time wins leader

QB during one of most successful eras in MU history; Holds numerous school records



Will Lewis, P (1976-79)

First Team All-American captained first MU playoff team; Long-time employee in NFL

Carmen Lex, P (1975-78)

All-American led MU to its first "state game" appearance

Scott Martin, P (1990-93)

3x All-PSAC East First Team; member of PA State Senate

Mike McFetridge, P (1995-98)

2x All-American was PSAC East Athlete of the Year in 1998

Sean Scott, P (1997-2000)

Finished career third for PSAC all-time marks in receptions and yards

Ricke Stonewall, P (1981-84)

School's leading rusher held PSAC single-game mark (350 yds) for 35 years

Edwin "Eddie" Weist, P (1939-41)

Rushing leader in his era led school's first undefeated team in 1940; Served as Marine in WWII

Led Shepherd to 17 conference titles and 13 NCAA appearances

George Hott, P (1954-55)

First NFL draft pick from school; Led team to its first undefeated season in 1955

Myles Humphrey, P (2014-17)

2x All-American & Academic All-American; School's career sack (40) and TFL (69) leader

Wayne Wilson, PC (1975-78 (Player))

Most recent SU player selected in the NFL draft; nine-year NFL career

John Bay, P (1935-38)

Shippensburg native who was the leading scorer on school's first PSAC Champions (1935)

Rob Davis, P (1988-89,1991-92)

2x All-PSAC selection was 10-year veteran of Green Bay Packers

Broke or tied 31 school records: 1981 PSAC Athlete of the Year

4x All-PSAC pick; PSAC career leader (27 INTs); 2x All-Pro in 12 NFL seasons

Trevor Harman, P (2011-14)

PSAC career records and top five in NCAA for receptions (321) and receiving touchdowns (61)

Spencer Keyes, P (1951-54)

Leader during era when SU won PSAC record 20 straight contests (1951-54)

John Kuhn, P (2001-04)

2x All-American and Academic All-American; 13-year NFL career

Mark 'Mac' Maciejewski, PC (1988-89,1991-92)

2x All-American; Two NCAA appearances and eight straight winning seasons as current head coach

Rocky Rees, C (1990-2010)

SU's all-time wins leader (123) served as AFCA President; Made three NCAA appearances

Zach Zulli, P (2010-13)

2012 Harlon Hill winner ranks third in PSAC with 123 career passing touchdowns

Jerry Bejbl, PO (1960-Present)

All-American helped SRU to two PSAC West titles; Has donated more than \$1 million to SRU

Bob DiSirito, C (1967-80, 1987)

Three straight PSAC Championship titles (1972-74) and four West titles; SRU field named in his honor

Terry Factor, P (1971-73)

3x First Team All-PSAC in all three years of varsity career; 331 career tackles ranks sixth at SRU

DJ Flick, P (1998-2001)

2x All-American as wide receiver and returner; school record 4,773 career all-purpose yards

Brandon Fusco, P (2007-10)

Upshaw DII Lineman of the Year has started more than 70 games in NFL

Shamar Greene, P (2012-16)


2x All-American; 3x All-PSAC performer ran for school record 4,275 yards

NCAA All-Divisions record holder with 56 career sacks; DII record 92.5 TFL; 4x All-American



2x All-American, 3x PSAC Athlete of the Year; SRU career passing leader led four PSAC West Champions

Dr. George Mihalik, PC (1973-2015)

Won three PSAC titles as player; eight PSAC-West crowns and six NCAA appearances as coach

Brian Polk, P (1996-99)

2x All-American and 1998 PSAC Athlete of the Year; Holds SRU record with 17 career interceptions

N. Kerr Thompson, C (1920-45)

Stadium named in his honor; Pioneer of SRU's athletic programs won 126 games with two perfect seasons

AFCA All-American in 1988 (1st Team WR, 2nd Team DB); ranks in top five in three categories at WCU

Joe Iacone, P (1960-62)

2x First Team AFCA All-American; still ranks third in rushing (3,956 yds) and second in TDs (41) at WCU

W. Glenn Killinger, C (1934-41, 1945-59)

All-time winningest coach in WCU history (147-41-12); member of College Football Hall of Fame



Derrick Price, P (1987-90)

2x All-PSAC East First Team; School record 2,173 KOR yards; ranks second in rushing and all-purpose

Joe Senser, P (1975-78)

Led team in receiving all four years; had four-year career with Minnesota Vikings

Ralp Tamm, P (1984-87)

First Team AFCA All-American; Starter on 49ers Super Bowl XXIV Champion team in his 10-year NFL career

Mike Washington, P (2005-08)

Only NCAA DI or DII player with 1,000 yds receiving all four years; PSAC record 4,716 career receiving yds

Chuck Weber, P (1950-52)

AFCA First Team All-American won NFL Champion ships with Browns (1955) and Eagles (1960)

Rondell White, P (2010-13)

First Team AFCA All-American holds two PSAC singleseason and three WCU all-time records

Lee Woodall, P (1989-92)

First Team AFCA All-American; eight-year NFL career inlcuding starter for 49ers Super Bowl XXIV Champions

Bill Zwann, C (2003-Present)

Nine NCAA appearances and six PSAC East titles in 16 years at WCU
