#1 Slippery Rock The Rock

Quick Hits

- Slippery Rock returns 18 starters from last season's NCAA quarterfinalist team that went 7-0 on the way to winning the PSAC West title. Of those 18 returning starters, 11 have seen significant time in the starting lineup on defense. The Rock return nine players with at least 12 starts.

- The Rock were ranked seventh in the final 2018 Division II national poll released by the American Football Coaches Association. Slippery Rock has now been nationally ranked at least one week in each of the last seven years.

- The Rock have put together 10 consecutive winning seasons entering the 2019 campaign. Slippery Rock has claimed four of the last six PSAC West titles and five of the last eight divisional crowns. The Rock have reached the NCAA Division II quarterfinals twice in the last four years and have made four NCAA playoff appearances in the last six years.

- Slippery Rock returns first team All-PSAC West quarterback Roland Rivers III, who accounted for 3,318 yards of total offense last year after throwing for 2,721 yards and 28 touchdowns and rushing for 597 yards and seven touchdowns.

- Rock placekicker Jake Chapla, who has been All-PSAC as both a kicker and punter in each of the last two years, enters his senior season with 275 career points.

#2 Cal U Vulcans

Quick Hits

- Cal U has tied for second in the PSAC West standings in each of the last two years and enters the 2019 campaign as the only PSAC program to win at least seven games each year since 2005.

- Senior DB Lamont McPhatter II anchors the defense after being a consensus First-Team All-American in 2018. He led NCAA Division II last season with 198 interception return yards while scoring a pair of defensive touchdowns.

- Sophomore QB Noah Mitchell directs the offense after being selected the 2018 PSAC West Freshman of the Year. He was first Cal U freshman to start a season-opener since 2004 and became the first Cal U quarterback chosen PSAC West Freshman of the Year since 1987.

- The Vulcans led the league and ranked among the top 10 in the country last year with both a .487 third-down conversion percentage and 0.64 sacks allowed per game. Cal U only allowed seven sacks on over 400 pass attempts last season.

- Senior RB Nelson Brown finished fourth in NCAA Division II last season with 22 total touchdowns after scoring multiple touchdowns in eight games. He is the only returning 1,000-yard running back in the PSAC this year after ranking fourth in the league with 1,201 rushing yards in 2018.

#3 IUP Crimson Hawks

Quick Hits

- IUP returns 16 starters from last year's team that went 8-3 and tied for second in the PSAC West standings with a 5-2 division record.

- 11 of those 16 starters are previous All-PSAC West selections while four have earned All-American honors: OC Jeff Arnold, OG Colin McAllister, LB Damon Lloyd and CB JR Stevens.

- One of the best programs in Division II history, IUP ranks in the top five in all-time win percentage (.673) and top 15 in all-time wins (568).

- Head coach Paul Tortorella enters his third season at the helm and carries a 21-4 record, the best two-year start in IUP history.

- The Crimson Hawks will break in a new starter at quarterback with the graduation of four-year starter and former All-American Lenny Williams, who is arguably the top signal caller in program history.

- Four starters – All-PSAC selections – return along the offensive line. Seniors Jeff Arnold, Colin McAllister and Ken Roman, and junior Josh Dauberman have combined for 108 games played and 90 starts.

- Senior linebackers Damon Lloyd and Nick Amendola enter their third year as starters. They have combined for four All-PSAC West selections and 480 career tackles.

#4 Mercyhurst Lakers

Quick Hits

- The Lakers return 15 of 22 starters from a year ago with seven on offense and eight on defense. Mercyhurst returns their top two tacklers in linebackers Jake Tarasovitch and Corbin Kessler. The duo combined for 152 tackles a season ago including nine tackles for loss.

- Junior Garrett Owens returns after a strong sophomore campaign that saw him rank fourth in the PSAC in rushing yards per game with 110.6. Among the top 25 rushers in the league he ranked second averaging 6.5 yards per carry.

- The Lakers will look for continued growth up front especially returning all their starters up front on defense. The group is comprised mostly of juniors and seniors that look to take the next step. Mercyhurst also returns three starters from the offensive line that paved the way for Garrett Owens to rush for nearly 1,000 yards in nine games.

#5 Edinboro Fighting Scots

Quick Hits

- Head coach Wayne Bradford has a 13-9 record after two seasons. The 13 wins are tied for the most by an Edinboro coach in his first two seasons.

- Edinboro had seven players earn All-PSAC West honors in 2018, with one returning on offense and one on defense. Wide receiver Ta'Nauz Gregory is a multi-talented threat who ranks among the career leaders in receiving and returns. The diminutive senior was the 2016 PSAC West Freshman of the Year, and in 2017 was a second team All-PSAC West choice as a return specialist before earning first team honors at wide receiver a year ago. In 2018, he led Edinboro in receptions (50), yards receiving (796), and receiving TDs (10) while playing in ten games.

- On the defensive side, Brandon Anderson earned first team All-PSAC West honors for the second straight year. He led the team in tackles for the second year in a row from his strong safety position, totaling 101 tackles, including a team-high 49 solo. He ranked third in the PSAC in tackles per game. Anderson leads an experienced secondary. Maurice Sims (60 tackles, 10.5 TFL) returns at nickel back after starting 10 games, while Bill DePaul (47 tackles, 3 INTs) started 10 games at free safety. Edinboro intercepted 19 passes to lead the PSAC and rank fifth in Division II.

- With Alex Molik gone, Vitaliy Gurman will move from center to left tackle. Gurman is a 6'4", 292 lb. junior who has started 21 games the last two years at center.

- Andrew Tomko is not only Edinboro's leading returning passer, but also the team's top returning rusher. In his first season as a starter, the redshirt junior threw for 1,433 yards and 12 TDs while starting six games.

#6 Gannon Golden Knights

Quick Hits

- Despite losing two of its top three tacklers from 2018, the Gannon defense brings back 58.2 percent of its total tackles, including seven defenders who recorded at least 30.

- Helping lead that charge are a pair of All-PSAC West performers in defensive lineman Andrew Berger and linebacker Jay Bullock. Berger leads all returners with 7.0 TFL and 3.5 sacks.

- Injuries hit the Golden Knights hard a year ago, leading three different quarterbacks to start at least two games, but all three signal callers who threw a pass in 2018 — Jason Dambach, Jimmy Keefe and Cody Callaway — are back.

- On the other side of the coin, Gannon will have to replace two-time consensus All-American Marcus Jones and his record production from the running back position. Melvin Blanks and Zevin Holley each got work last year, combining for 259 yards and a 4.3 yards per carry average.

- Helping to pave the way on offense will be a pair of linemen who have appeared in all 22 games over the past two seasons in Aaron Britton and Mac Chambers. Kiley Smith also started the first three games last season before an injury.

#7 Clarion Golden Eagles

Quick Hits

- Clarion enters the season having graduated four of its five all-conference selections from a year ago, including First Team All-PSAC West selection Brandon Vocco. Senior defensive lineman Saif Khan is the lone returning all-conference selection, having earned Second Team honors in 2018.

- Junior running back Mylique McGriff averaged 100.6 all-purpose yards per game last year and is averaging 5.5 yards per touch over the course of his two-year career; his 78.5 yards per game rushing is the most for Clarion backs since 1999.

- The Golden Eagles return all five starting defensive backs from a unit that ranked third in the PSAC in passing defense, limiting opponents to 191.5 yards per game and holding them to just a 49.7 completion percentage, the best mark in the league.

- Senior wide receiver Dana Jackson ranked fourth in the PSAC with a 17.8 yards per catch average and led Clarion with four receiving touchdowns. The Golden Eagles return three of their top four pass catchers from a year ago, and overall 58 percent of their catches from last season

- Senior safety Sam Fareri earned Google Cloud Academic All-America honors a year ago, making him the four Golden Eagle in as many years to make his way onto the team. Fareri led the team with four interceptions and two forced fumbles in 2018, and ranked second in tackles.

Quick Hits

- West Chester is the defending conference champion, after defeating Slippery Rock in the PSAC Championship Game one year ago, to claim its conference-best 19th championship.

- West Chester has appeared in the PSAC Championship Game in each of the past two seasons and in three of the last four overall (2015, 2017, 2018).

- West Chester led the PSAC in 10 team categories, including scoring offense and defense, rushing offense and defense and total defense.

- DB Jarey Elder led the PSAC and ranked third nationally in Division II with seven interceptions last fall. He returns as a preseason All-America selection by a pair of organizations (College Football America Starting Lineup and Street & Smith).

- West Chester has not lost more than one game in conference play in a single season since 2012 – stretching a span of six consecutive years in which the Golden Rams either went undefeated, or lost just one game against a conference foe.

#2 Shepherd Rams

Quick Hits

- Shepherd joins the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) this season. The PSAC is the fourth conference that Shepherd has held membership in. The Rams were charter members of the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) and remained members throughout the league's history (1924-2013). The Rams briefly held dual conference affiliation as a member of the Mason-Dixon Conference from 1964-68. Shepherd was a member of the Mountain East Conference (MEC) from 2013-2019.

- Sophomore quarterback Tyson Bagent returns after a stellar freshman season in 2018. Bagent set single-game marks for completions, attempts, and passing yards when he completed 36-of-56 passes for 518 yards in the season opener against Notre Dame. He also set a Shepherd and MEC mark with seven touchdown passes against West Virginia Wesleyan. Bagent's 253 completions established a Shepherd single-season mark. A first team All-MEC choice, Bagent was a three-time MEC Offensive Player of the Week.

- The Shepherd defense will be led by junior linebacker Chrys Lane and junior outside linebacker Ponce DeLeon. Lane led the Rams with 78 total tackles (48 solos) in 2018. He added 10.5 tackles-for-loss (-62 yards), 3.0 sacks (-20 yards), and a pair of forced fumbles. DeLeon added 58 total stops (36 solos). He added 6.0 tackles-for-loss (-18 yards) and 1.5 sacks (-11 yards). DeLeon recorded a team-best five interceptions, two pass breakups, a forced fumble, and a fumble recovery.

- The Rams will have 11 regular season games for the first time since the 2011 season. Shepherd opens the season at home against Ohio Dominican on Sept. 7.

- Shepherd has a 38-52-5 overall mark in season openers with a 19-19-3 record at home. The Rams are 8-2 in their last 10 season openers with a 5-0 mark at home.

#3 Kutztown Golden Bears

Quick Hits

- Kutztown heads into the 2019 season looking to build off the momentum of reaching the program's third NCAA Division II Championship tournament all-time and first under current head coach Jim Clements. The Golden Bears have enjoyed five consecutive winning seasons since Clements' arrival in 2014 and have increased their win totals in each of the last three seasons.

- Redshirt senior quarterback Collin DiGalbo has flourished with his arm and his feet. The three-time All-PSAC East Second Team selection has accounted for more than 7,300 yards of offense and 67 touchdowns through the air and on the ground. He threw for 2,470 yards and 15 touchdowns, rushed for 553 yards and 11 scores and set new career-highs in passing yards per game (247.0) and rushing yards per game (55.3) in leading KU to a nine-win season in 2018.

- Continuity is key up front and the Golden Bears expect to have their entire 2018 starting offensive line back, which should pay huge dividends. Protection from tackles Jake Adams and Justin Tindull, guards Luke Lozowicki and Jayson Williams and center Matt Cella was crucial in Kutztown leading the PSAC and ranking 12th in all of Division II with 471.1 yards of offense per game last fall. Cella, Tindull and Williams were voted to the All-PSAC East First Team.

- Senior cornerback Ahkee Cox-Cowan has been a nuisance for opposing quarterbacks and wide receivers throughout his career. The Harrisburg product holds KU single-season records for pass breakups (17) and passes defended (20), both set in 2017, and is within striking distance of becoming the program's all-time leader in both categories.

- Redshirt junior Dean Krcic is a true field-flipper and was recognized as the top punter in the PSAC East last season after averaging 41.6 yards per punt and placing 12 inside the 20-yard line.

#4 Shippensburg Red Raiders

Quick Hits

- Shippensburg enters 2019 having matched its longest streak of consecutive winning seasons in school history, as all eight of head coach Mark Maciejewski's years directing the Red Raiders have resulted in six or more victories.

- From 2011-18 under Maciejewski, Shippensburg boasts the top scoring offense in the PSAC - averaging 38.3 points per game. Additionally, Shippensburg's 2.76 sacks-per-game average is the best rate in the PSAC over the last eight seasons, while SU's 251 sacks is tied for the second-most in the conference in that span.

- In 2018, Shippensburg led the PSAC in passing (308.1 yards per game), completions (258), passing first downs (142) and fourth-down conversions (15). The Red Raiders were second in first downs (249) and fourth in scoring (33.8 points per game), while the defense's four touchdowns led the PSAC and ranked seventh in the nation.

- Projected returners from last season include the PSAC Eastern Division Offensive Athlete of the Year, redshirt-senior wide receiver Josh Gontarek, and the PSAC Eastern Division Freshman of the Year, redshirt-sophomore quarterback Brycen Mussina.

- Gontarek finished the regular season ranked 10th in the nation for receiving yards (1,097), ranking second in the conference for the category along with 74 receptions. In four games against NCAA Football Championships qualifiers in 2018, Gontarek totaled 29 receptions for 556 receiving yards and three touchdowns.

- Mussina, as a rookie, led the PSAC in five major passing categories, including touchdowns (32), yards (3,376), completions (254), attempts (421) and yards-per-game average (306.9). He was the only conference quarterback to eclipse both 3,000 passing yards and 30 touchdowns this season - both totals rank third in SU single-season history.

#5 Bloomsburg Huskies

Quick Hits

- Bloomsburg finished the 2018 season with a 6-5 overall record which gave the Huskies their 20th consecutive season with a winning record and their 20th straight year with at least six victories. The latter is a conference record and the winning-season streak is the third longest in conference history, behind West Chester (31) and Clarion (22).
- Bloomsburg will return three All-PSAC selections from a season ago - running back Alex Gooden, wide receiver Michael Allen, and placekicker Jaco Sattamini - each of whom earned Second Team accolades. Fullback Jack Gaugler earned Don Hansen All-Region honors last season and comes back to serve as the Huskies' anticipated lead blocker in 2019. Running back Qmac Quiteh, who was a Second Team honoree in 2017, also returns for his final season.
- Bloomsburg has scored at least one point in 184 consecutive games dating back to a 21-0 home loss against Shippensburg on September 13, 2003.
- In 69 games under head coach Paul Darragh, the Huskies' defense has recorded at least one sack 57 times (82.6%). On the flip side, the Huskies' offense has never reached 300 yards passing in a game in the six seasons under Darragh but, has only been held under 100 yards rushing eight times - Bloomsburg is 1-7 in those games including an 0-2 mark in 2018.
- Gooden and Quiteh return for their final seasons with both having a chance to become the 14th and 15th players in program history to reach 2,000 career rushing yards. Gooden enters needing 316 while Quiteh is 484 rushing yards shy of the milestone.

- New head coach Jimmy Terwilliger will look to lead the Warriors in his first full season in 2019. Terwilliger was promoted to head coach in February 2019. The upcoming season will be his fifth on the Warriors' coaching staff.
- Terwilliger served as associate head coach during the 2018 season, leading the program in an interim capacity for the final two games after legendary head coach Denny Douds stepped aside following 45 years at the helm.
- The Warriors return a pair of quarterbacks in Jake Cirillo and Ben Moser. Both combined for 184 completions, 2,514 passing yards, and 18 touchdowns. #8 Lock Haven Bald Eagles

Quick Hits

- All-American tight end Jalen Jackson returns to lead the way for the Bald Eagle offense. Following a remarkable sophomore season in 2018, Jackson was named to three different All-American Teams after earning First Team All-Region and All-PSAC East honors. Jackson, one of the premier tight ends in all of Division II football and one of the most dynamic offense threats in the PSAC, led all players at the position in the PSAC with seven receiving touchdowns last season. Jackson hauled in 44 catches for 537 yards. Jackson averaged 48.8 receiving yards per game. He capped the season with a three-touchdown game in the thrilling win over Gannon in the season-finale on the road.

- Dual-threat quarterback Kyle Knight returns to the field for Lock Haven. Knight, who will be a redshirt-sophomore, suffered a season-ending injury during Week 1 of the last season, but he will look to build off a remarkable true-freshman season in 2017.

- Running back Chantz Swartz and wide receiver Bryan Greene return to help round out an impressive group of offensive returners who stood out a year ago for the Bald Eagles. Swartz and Green, both of whom were All-PSAC East Offensive Second Team selections last season. Last season, Greene hauled in 41 catches for 578 yards and three TDs. In 2018, Swartz carried the ball 126 times for 759 yards. He averaged 69 rushing yards per game and scored five rushing TDs on the season. Swartz also had four touchdown catches and led the Bald Eagles in scoring with 48 points.

- Linebacker Alex Welch is LHU's top returning defensive player. Last season he made 69 tackles (30 solo, 5.5 TFL, 1 sack, 3 brup, 3 ff). Welch, a redshirt-junior headlines a trio of extremely talented returning linebackers. Shane Scott and Austin Barber, are both raising sophomores who started last season as true-freshmen.

For the LHU football program, the 2019 marks the Bald Eagles 40th anniversary of their 1979 PSAC Championship. Overall, LHU went 9-2 overall during the '79 season. Lock Haven was a perfect 6-0 in PSAC West play that season on the way to the regular season divisional title. In the title game that season, the Bald Eagles rolled by Cheyney, 48-14.
