- West Chester returns four starters from last year's team that finished 22-7 overall and won a game in the NCAA tournament for the first time in program history.
- Of their four returning starters, three earned PSAC laurels last season: Matt Penecale (All-PSAC East Second Team), Jackson Hyland (All-PSAC East Second Team), and Frank Rokins (PSAC East Defensive Athlete of the Year).
- After a year away from the team, junior guard Malik Jackson returns for the Golden Rams in 2018-19. Jackson averaged 19.2 points per game during the 2016-17 season and was named All-PSAC East Second Team for his efforts. Jackson's 19.2 points per game (No. 5 in the PSAC) during his sophomore campaign stands as the highest scoring average by a WCU player since 2002-03.
- The Golden Rams added four newcomers over the offseason, including two big men (both 6-8) and a high-scoring guard. Head Coach Damian Blair also junior added combo guard Ian Langendoerfer, who comes to West Chester after appearing in 39 games for NCAA DI Loyola University (Maryland).
- Senior guard Matt Penecale enters his final season with the Golden Rams just 59 assists away (397 for his career) from breaking WCU's all-time assists record.

- R-Sr. G Jakwan Jones, 2nd team All-PSAC East and 2nd in the PSAC in assists (5.7 apg), leads a group that returns 6 of 10 players that scored at least 5 ppg last year as the Warriors ranked 4th in DII in scoring (92.0 ppg), led DII in steals (11.5) and was 2nd in turnover margin (+6.7)
- ESU's 4 key departures include forward Steve Harris (15.4 ppg, 7.3 rpg, 66.0 fg%), 1st team All-PSAC East, NABC All-Region and MVP of the PSAC and Atlantic Regional tournaments

#3 SHIPPENSBURG RAIDERS

- Shippensburg returns two starters from a squad that posted a 25-8 overall record and reached the NCAA Atlantic Region Championship game ("Sweet Sixteen") for the first time in school history. The Raiders made their second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and fourth overall in school history.
- Shippensburg led the country last season in free-throw percentage (80.6 percent; 495-of-614). That total is the best in PSAC single-season history and ranks 10th all-time in NCAA Division II single-season history. The Raiders also set new single-season school records last season for total points (2,666), three-pointers (345) and assists (544).
- SU must account for the departure of its 2017-18 senior class (two-time All-American Dustin Sleva, school-record holder for career three-pointers Justin McCarthur, and point guard Clay Conner). The three seniors combined for 4,332 points, 1,534 rebounds, 953 assists, 574 three-pointers, 1,028 free throws and a combined 80.6 free-throw percentage.
- SU's roster breakdown features two seniors, five juniors, two sophomores and six freshman. The Raiders have 10 returning players and five newcomers. Of the five newcomers, two are JUCO transfers. In addition to returning starters Antonio Kellem and John Castello, returning contributors Jake Biss, Manny Span, Dom Sleva and Lamar Talley are among those expected to have significantly expanded roles this season.
- Shippensburg is coached by Chris Fite, the 2016-17 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Atlantic Region Coach of the Year and the 2016-17 PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year. SU has achieved three straight 20-win seasons under Fite after totaling two 20-win seasons in its previous 62 years of basketball. Over the last three seasons, SU has posted a 72-21 record under Fite.

#6 BLOOMSBURG HUSKIES

Quick Hits

- Bloomsburg has made the PSAC tournament in each of the last three seasons and in six of the last seven years. The Huskies, however, have not advanced past the first round of the playoffs since the 2013-14 season.
- Head coach John Sanow enters his 13th season as the head coach of the Huskies and has guided the team to a 148-175 overall record. He ranks second in Bloomsburg's all-time career coaching victories list, trailing only Charlie Chronister who won 559 games from 1971-2002.
- The Huskies must find a way to replace Christian Mortellite who graduated as the school's all-time leading scorer with 2,037 career points and the program's all-time leader in career three-pointers with 314. Also lost to graduation are Kyle-Michael Rose (second all-time in career blocks at Bloomsburg with 135) and Hashim Moore who averaged 10.4 points and 5.1 rebounds last season in his only year at Bloomsburg.
- Bloomsburg returns two starters junior Ky Mauras and redshirt junior Sam Saxton. Mauras recorded what is believed to be the program's firstever triple-double last season with 21 points, 11 rebounds, and 13 assists in a win over Lock Haven. Saxton, meanwhile, was third on the team with 19 three-pointers.
- The Huskies only have one senior on the roster Darius Robinson-Wallace

 who has averaged 2.5 points and 1.8 rebounds in 45 career games (seven starts).

- Lombardi is 12th in PSAC history and third amongst active coaches with 275 career wins.

#2 SLIPPERY ROCK THE ROCK

Quick Hits

- Slippery Rock is under the direction of 11th year head coach Kevin Reynolds. Reynolds has averaged 17.1 wins per year since taking over the program in 2008. His teams have won 20 or more games six times in the last 10 years and have reached three NCAA Division II postseason tournaments. SRU is coming off a 21-9 overall record last winter that ended in the second round of the PSAC tournament.
- Slippery Rock returns just one player from the 2017-18 roster in All-American forward Micah Till. The rest of The Rock roster includes one player from a former SRU team in Vinny Lasley, who played in 2016-17, but did not play last year. The rest of the roster is made up of 10 transfer students and four true freshmen.
- Micah Till was named a Street and Smith Preseason All-American entering this winter. He was one of the most dominant players in Division II last winter in his first season at SRU, when he averaged 21.0 points and 12.0 rebounds per game. He ranked third in the nation in double-doubles after the regular season after putting up 22 double-doubles in 30 games and he scored more than 20 points in 21 different outings. Till led the nation in total rebounds over the regular season and was the only player in the country to score at least 600 points and grab at least 350 rebounds during the regular season. He finished the year ranked third all-time in single-season scoring at SRU (640 points) and set a new program record for single-season rebounds with 361. He also blocked 45 shots, had 40 steals, handed out 38 assists and shot .494 from the field and a team-high .728 from the free throw line.
- Transfer Guard John Warren II started 62 games and appeared in 99 games for Augustana University over three years before missing last season. He was named an All-Conference player in the NSIC after his junior year in 2016-17 after averaging 14.1 points, 5.7 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.6 steals per game.

The Fighting Scots were picked to finish eighth in last year's PSAC preseason poll, but would end the season fourth. In fact, Jaymon Mason departed as Edinboro's all-time leading scorer with 2,005 points and was a two-time All-American and three-time All-PSAC performer, Keshawn Liggins was named to several All-American teams and was a first team All-PSAC selection a year ago after leading the PSAC in scoring at 23.8 ppg. and finishing third in rebounding at 10.4 per
- Cleary is expecting Trey Staunch to once again join the basketball team when the football season concludes. A year ago, Staunch proved a huge factor in Edinboro's stretch run. A starter in over 30 games at right tackle, he transitioned to the hardcourt after not playing since high school. The 6'4", 270 lb. forward would average 8.0 ppg. and 3.7 rpg. while coming off the bench and averaging just over 17 minutes per contest.
