#2 EAST STROUDSBURG WARRIORS

Quick Hits

- ESU returns 4 of 5 starters from last year's team, which went 16-11 and finished 2nd in the PSAC East for the 2nd straight season, following its first PSAC Final 4 trip in 10 years in 2016-17
- Jr. G Tiffany Lapotsky (11.6 ppg, 2nd team All-PSAC East) and Jr. G Jordan Hertz (6.9 ppg, 5.2 rpg, 4.6 apg) give the Warriors an experienced backcourt, with So. F Marlene Bassett (9.9 ppg, 5.1 rpg) leading the frontcourt after a strong freshman season
- Imani Brown, last year's PSAC East Athlete of the Year (18.6 ppg, 6.6 rpg), is the only departure among ESU's top 7 scorers and ranked 4th in the PSAC in scoring as a senior
- Sr. G Noelle Powell was one of three Warriors named 1st team All-PSAC East as a sophomore in 2016-17 (13.0 ppg) before being limited to 22 games off the bench (6.9 ppg) due to injury last year
- ESU has records of 15-13, 19-9 and 16-11 the last three seasons since the arrival of head coach Diane Decker after posting a winning record in just one of the previous eight years

#3 WEST CHESTER GOLDEN RAMS

Quick Hits

- West Chester lost its four out of its five starters from last year and top-four leading scorers who accounted for 1592 out of West Chester's 2384 points.
- West Chester returns reigning PSAC East Coach of the year Kiera Wooden who is expected to have a full season on the bench in 2018.
- Former UMBC Transfer and standout forward Madison Torresin is expected to be back in 18-19 after missing last season. In 2016-17 Torresin scored 259 averaging 12.3 points per game while also leading the team in rebounds with 174 (8.3 rpg) and finishing second on the team in steals with 33.
- West Chester did not lose its first 18 games of 2018 last year closing the regular season on a 17-game winning streak before going 1-2 in the postseason losing to Edinboro in the PSAC Semifinals and Glenville St. in the NCAA Tournament. WCU finished 2018 with an 18-2 overall record. Also finished last season just two wins shy of tying school wins record of 25 set by Deidre Kane's 1995-96 team.
- West Chester's top and only returning starter is junior guard Katherine Fisher who ended last season averaging 8.7 points per game and 4.5 rebounds per game while also chipping in 62 assists and 27 steals. Fisher's best game of the season came on 2/3/18 at Kutztown when she poured in 15 points to go along with eight rebounds.

#4 BLOOMSBURG HUSKIES

Quick Hits

- Bloomsburg returns two All-PSAC East Second Team selections from a year ago in senior Alyssa Mack and junior Taylor Montana. Mack led the team in scoring last season at 10.6 points per game and led the team in assists with 59. She scored at least 20 points in a game five times. Montana led the team in rebounding (6.1) and was second on the team in scoring at 9.0 points per game. She was also second on the team with 23 blocked shots.
- Alison Tagliaferri is in her third season at Bloomsburg and has an overall record of 24-33. She has guided the Huskies to back-to-back postseason appearances which included an upset win at West Chester in the opening round of the 2017 PSAC Tournament.
- The Huskies have the luxury of returning seven players who started at least nine games for the Huskies last season – Meghan Corridoni (27 starts), Emma Saxton (24 starts), Payton Spadaccino (17 starts), Megan Brandt (16 starts), Alyssa Mack (12 starts), Marissa Molnar (12 starts), and Taylor Montana (9 starts).
- Bloomsburg has two seniors on this year's roster – Alyssa Mack and Marissa Molnar – after having no seniors on the team a year ago. Molnar finished second on the team – to Mack – in three-pointers with 32 and averaged 6.1 points per game.
- The Huskies finished 16th in the league in scoring last season, averaging only 59.8 points per game. However, Bloomsburg's defense was fifth in the league in points allowed as it gave up only 63.0 points per contest.

#5 MILLERSVILLE MARAUDERS

Quick Hits

- The Marauders made it all the way to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Championship game in 2017-18 after not having advanced past the first round of the tournament since the 2012-13 season. Millersville fell to No. 11 Edinboro 77-66 in the team's first conference championship appearance since 2004-05.
- The Marauders reached the PSAC championship game after upsetting No. 8 Indiana (Pa.) in the semifinal round 89-86 in triple overtime. The Crimson Hawks were the top seed in the highly competitive PSAC West and had not lost at home all season prior to this match.
- The 2018-19 team will feature many new faces, as eight freshmen comprise eight of Millersville's 14 roster spots.
- Alayah Hall, who led the team with 17 points per game and 62 steals is one of six players who will not be returning to the Marauders this season.
- Sophomore Lauren Lister, who broke the program scoring record for freshmen with 378 points last season, was second on Millersville with 12.6 points per game and led the team in field goal percentage with a .480 mark.

#6 SHIPPENSBURG RAIDERS

Quick Hits

- Shippensburg returns four players from last year's team, a Raider squad that posted a 7-21 overall record and a 6-16 record in conference play. SU enters 2018-19 with one junior transfer and zero seniors on its roster. Of the 15 players on the team, 14 are "underclassmen" in terms of athletic eligibility as sophomores or freshmen. Of the team's 11 newcomers, nine are true freshmen.
- The Raiders are highlighted by sophomore Ariel Jones, the 2017-18 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division Women's Basketball Freshman of the Year and was the only freshman to earn All-PSAC First Team honors. Jones, who set the PSAC's all-time freshman scoring record (609 points), is the first freshman named to the All-PSAC First Team in either the Eastern or Western Division since California's Kayla Smith in 2007-08 – a 10-year span.
- Jones led the PSAC and ranked eighth in the nation in scoring with 21.8 points per game. She was the only freshman to rank among the nation's Top 30 scorers. Jones became the 21st player (and only freshman) in PSAC history to reach 600 points in a single season, finishing with 609 points to rank seventh in the SU record books for the category.
- Sophomore forward Kryshell Gordy returns after a solid debut season in the post. Gordy averaged 7.8 points and 8.3 rebounds while recording four double-doubles in her first season with the Raiders. She will join Jones as a returning starter.
- Among the SU newcomers expected to make a strong impact are forwards Aunbrielle Green, Lauren Mills, and Lauren Pettis (Susquehanna Township).

#8 MANSFIELD MOUNTAINEERS

Quick Hits

- A young team comprised of seven returning sophomores and six incoming freshmen, add senior two-sport athlete Brooke Roys this season, led by redshirt senior McKenzie Hatch. Seven players averaged at least one assist per game, three of whom return this season.
- Opened the 2017-18 campaign (3-1) through the first four games, which included the PSAC-MEC Conference Challenge, with wins coming against West Virginia State University, University of Pittsburgh at Bradford, and Seton Hill University.
- Coach Michael Whitling was the fastest coach in program history to lead a team to the postseason, guiding Mansfield to a PSAC Tournament berth in his second season at the helm in 2017-18. It was just the third time in program history the Mounties appeared in playoffs and the first time in 11 years.
- Returners McKenzie Hatch and Erin Gibbons led the 2017-18 team with 1.9 and 1.8 assists per game. Gibbons led all 2018 returning players with 9.5 PPG, converted 72% of her Free Throws, and also connected on a team-high 31.4% from 3PT, while playing 32.3 minutes per game. She and Mia Leonard brought down 3.6 rebounds per game. Leonard tallied 14 blocks on the season. Paige Whitfield was a defensive presence for the Mounties, coming up with 23 steals on the year.

WESTERN DIVISION #1 EDINBORO FIGHTING SCOTS

Quick Hits

- After serving as an assistant to head coach Stan Swank for 11 years, Callie Wheeler takes over as Edinboro's fifth head coach. Wheeler inherits a team that finished 27-4 a year ago, winning the PSAC championship and reaching the semifinals of the Atlantic Regional. Wheeler played for Edinboro from 2002-06 and was inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 2016.
- Wheeler inherits an Edinboro team that has now won 20-or-more games each of the last eight years.
- Four starters return, and all were All-PSAC honorees last year. The quartet is led by Ciara Rosten, who was named the PSAC West Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year. She was the first player in PSAC history to earn two major awards. She earned WBCA honorable mention All-American accolades, along with being named a D2CCA second team All-American and third team Division II Bulletin All-American. Rosten averaged 15.8 ppg., second on the team, while leading the team in rebounding at 12.2 rpg. and ranking second in assists (108). She tied for first in the PSAC in field goal percentage at 49.4 percent (208-of-421), while leading the PSAC and ranking third in Division II in rebounds per game, along with leading the country in rebounds with 377, the third-highest total in a season at Edinboro. She also paced the PSAC and was fifth in Division II in blocks per game (3.77), along with ranking fourth in the country in total blocks with a school-record 117.
- Jontay Walton led the Fighting Scots in scoring, assists and steals and joined Rosten on the All-PSAC West first team. A 5'6" guard who graduated in May and is now in graduate school, Walton averaged 16.5 ppg. with 132 assists, and 73 steals.

#2 IUP CRIMSON HAWKS

Quick Hits

- The Crimson Hawks return three starters and four more lettermen from last year's Atlantic Region Championship team that won a school record 30 games and advanced to the national semifinals in Sioux Falls, S.D. Starters returning include seniors Carolyn Appleby, Brittany Robinson and Lauren Wolosik.
- IUP head coach Tom McConnell is 118-34 (.776) with one 30 and three 20-win seasons in five years leading the Crimson Hawks. He's taken IUP to four NCAA tournaments and has two PSAC West regular season titles, a PSAC tournament crown, and a regional championship under his belt.
- The Crimson Hawks have been the second most successful team over the last four years with 99 victories and 73 conference wins – Cal has 111 and 75, respectively.
- Appleby is a two-time All-PSAC West selection who enters her final year in the top 20 of eight career IUP records. She's been dominant in the postseason, with a PSAC Tournament MVP, Atlantic Region Tournament MVP, and Elite Eight All-Tournament Team honors the last two years.
- Wolosik is aiming to become first player in program history to amass 1,000 points and 400 assists in career. She enters her final year with 934 and 284, respectively.

- The Vulcans have made the NCAA Tournament 15 times in the past 17 years and were eliminated last year in the first round for the first time since 2007.
- Cal U returns a two-time All-PSAC West selection in senior forward Seairra Barrett. She missed all of last season due to injury and enters the year with nearly 1,300 points and 750 rebounds in her career.
- The Vulcans led the league and ranked seventh in the country with 13.4 steals per game. Cal U also featured the top three players in the PSAC in steals per game.
- Cal U posted its fourth-consecutive 20-win campaign last year and has reached the milestone 15 times in the last 17 seasons.
- Sophomore Bianca Jasper entered the starting lineup midway through the year and ranked fourth in the PSAC in assist-to-turnover ratio before missing the last six games due to injury.

Quick Hits

- Slippery Rock returns all five starters and two reserves from last year's team that went 12-16 overall and 10-12 in the always-competitive Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division.
- In addition to earning its second PSAC Tournament berth in the last four years a season ago, The Rock's 12 overall wins represented the third most victories for SRU in the last 14 seasons while the 10 league wins were a program record.
- Head coach Bobby McGraw returns for his fifth season in charge of The Rock women's basketball program in 2018-19. McGraw has orchestrated one of the top turnaround's in all of Division II over the last four years. SRU won just 19 games in the four seasons prior to McGraw's arrival, but since taking over at SRU McGraw has led Slippery Rock to 45 victories. - Leading The Rock in 2018-19 will be junior Brooke Hinderliter. One of the top all-around guards in the PSAC West, Hinderliter averaged 14.1 points, 6.5 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 1.3 steals per game as a sophomore on the way to earning all-conference honors.
- Other key returners for Slippery Rock include senior guard Ciara Patterson (15.8 points per game), senior forward Morgan Henderson (9.3 ppg, 5.3 rpg), junior guard Madison Johnson (9.2 ppg) and junior forward LeeAnn Gibson (6.6 ppg, 4.8 rpg).
